Aspire Indiana Health is proud to offer Military-Focused Care to our veterans and their families, addressing medical, behavioral health, substance use, housing and employment needs. We are nonprofit and certified as a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) as well as an Indiana Community Mental Health Center (CMHC).

Aspire has always served veterans, but the mission to serve this underserved population is now more important than ever.

Our Commitment

We welcome all branches of the military, veterans and their families through whatever door they come to Aspire — and ensure you are connected to all our services.

At Aspire, we believe effective treatment is comprehensive, and that means an integrated approach to caring for the biological, psychological and social needs of each patient.

As the veteran population continues to evolve, so does Aspire's depth and breadth of services to support veterans and their families.

Our Services

- Veterans have access to Star Behavioral Health Providers (SBHP), civilian health professionals who undergo special training to better understand service-related challenges and the unique factors that may impact clinical practice with military-connected clients.
- We accept TRICARE, the uniformed services healthcare program for active duty service members, active duty family members, National Guard and Reserve members and their family members, retirees and retiree family members, survivors, and certain former spouses worldwide.

Aspire Indiana Health accepts TRICARE, Medicaid, Medicare and most commercial insurance. We also offer a sliding fee scale for clients who are uninsured and have health navigators to assist people in obtaining coverage.

- Veterans have access to all of Aspire’s Social Impact Services, including employment services, civil legal services, benefits counseling and housing services. Aspire also receives a housing grant, Support Services for Veteran Families (SSVF), which helps prevent veterans from losing their homes, find new housing, re-house homeless veterans and their families and promote housing stability.
