Grants & Loans

The Haliwa-Saponi Indian Tribe has partnered with USDA Rural Development to bring housing resources to the tribal community.

What does this program do?

Also known as the Section 504 Home Repair program, this provides loans to very-low-income homeowners to repair, improve or modernize their homes or grants to elderly very-low-income homeowners to remove health and safety hazards.

Who may apply for this program?

To qualify, you must:

Be the homeowner and occupy the house.

Be unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere.

Have a household income that does not exceed the very low limit by county.

For grants, be age 62 or older.

Who can answer questions and how do I get started?

Applications are accepted for this program at the Chief W.R. Richardson Tribal Government Complex. For more information on how to apply, contact Tosha Silver, Housing Coordinator, phone # 252-248-3750.


Haliwa-Saponi Veterans Memorial Committee
Tribal Veterans Memorial Dedication Ceremony

A Dedication Ceremony was held on Saturday, March 29, 2025, at 10 am to celebrate the new Haliwa-Saponi Veterans Memorial located on the grounds of the Chief W.R. Richardson Tribal Government Complex in Hollister, NC. The ceremony included the unveiling of a black granite monument in the shape of an arrowhead, as well as the unveiling of two matching black granite benches dedicated in memory of deceased Tribal veterans CPO R. Purcell Daniel and SP4 Dalton A. Lynch. Engraved brick pavers bearing the names, branches of service and service dates of deceased and living veterans were also unveiled. Guest speakers included Chief Dr. Ogletree Richardson, Vice Chief Dr. Marvin Richardson, Greg Richardson of the NC Commission of Indian Affairs, Halifax County Commissioners Chenoa Davis and Jimmie Silver, Warren County Commissioner Al Cooper, Jr, Mr. Elk Richardson, former Vice Chief and NC Commission of Indian Affairs representative, Merck Pharmaceutical representative Tonya Brown, William Amerson of the Combat Veterans Motorcycle Association, and keynote speaker, Vietnam Veteran, retired USMC MGySgt Lonzie McCray Evans. A reception with light refreshments followed immediately after the ceremony which was hosted by the Haliwa-Saponi Veterans Memorial.

The date of the ceremony coincided with National Vietnam Veterans Day, which is most appropriate given the high number of Haliwa Saponi tribal veterans who served during that era. This unveiling represented the culmination of the joint efforts of Committee members, the Tribal Council, Community (Business) Partners and the community who devoted six years to the planning process before reaching the point of holding a Groundbreaking Ceremony on September 18th, 2024. Members of the Committee include Chair, Jewel McGee-Bissonnette, Pastor Al Cooper, Jr, Alfred "Morris" Richardson, Jimmie Silver, Arnold Lynch, Kim Silver, Sylvia Evans-Richardson, Bobby J. Richardson, and Micker Richardson.




