# **SCRIPTURE READING** Isaiah 42:2-3

"He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice."

**Devotion:** Isaiah 42:2-3 paints a tender picture of Jesus, the Servant of the Lord, who comes not with harshness

or overpowering force, but with gentleness and compassion. This passage reminds us that our Savior deeply un-

derstands human weakness, brokenness, and pain, and He meets us where we are with patience and grace. • A Savior Who Comes in Humility: Unlike rulers or leaders who demand attention with loud declarations, Jesus came in quiet humility. He didn't seek to elevate Himself through power or noise but chose to demon-

strate God's love through service, kindness, and sacrifice. His approach invites us to trust Him, knowing He

- A Tender Touch for the Broken: The imagery of a bruised reed and a faintly burning wick reflects the fragility of human hearts. Perhaps you feel like a bruised reed—damaged by life's struggles, barely holding together. Or maybe you feel like a faintly burning wick, your faith or hope dimmed by exhaustion or doubt. Jesus does not break or extinguish these fragile things. Instead, He gently restores, nurtures, and breathes life back into what seems weak or fading.
