Annual Church Meeting — June 25, 2025

The meeting was called to order by Harvey Whitley and Dr. Chris Dawson opened with prayer.

Dr. Chris Dawson presented the New Officer Nominees for the 202! -2026 Church year. No one had any others to present. Mr. Whitley floored the nominees to a vote. These officers were all voted in unar mously.

The Adoption of the 2025-2026 Church Budget was presented by Dr. Chris Dawson and Carolyn White. A reason was given for each line item that was either an increase or decrease. The New Budget total is \$357,533 compared to last year's budget of of \$351,351. This reflects a decrease of (\$6,182), which i only a change of (1.7%). The decrease is mainly due to decreases in the Ministry Coordinator new starting salary, Custodial Services Expenses being decreased to no preschool at this time, and various decreases in other areas. These decreases are offset by an increase in Property Insurance. Mr. Whitley floored the Budget, and all approved.

The Treasurer's report was given by Mr. Joel Myers. He presented the Financial Summary as of May 31, 2025, and for seven nine months, September 2024 through May 2025. Mr. Myers pointed out the Total Revenue \$250,823 and Expenses \$260,755 which leaves a deficit of \$9,932. The collections \$17,327 short, but the Church underspent \$7,395 in expenses. General checking has a balance of \$12,127 and the Special designated funds have a balance of \$88,075. The Mutual Funds are a total of \$200,000 and Preschool checking is \$7,572.

Following the Financial Report was the Church Clerk, Crystal Brantley. Ms. Brantley reported that the Church now has a total membership of 310. She reported for this quarter that we had no new members and transfer by letter was Joe Litaker and Jessie Ruth Litaker

The Board of Trustee Report was from Carolyn White. The Steeple repair will take place soon. The contractor is waiting on a lift to be able to do the repair. The Trustees approved to pay the \$12,000 HVAC bill with \$6,000 from the columbarium fund and \$6,000 from the interest from the Mutual Funds. The Trustees also approved for a group of Girl Scouts to meet at the church and if all goes well, First Baptist could start their own Girl Scout group. The new Church sign is still in the process. Dr. Dawson and Mrs. White will be meeting with the sign company soon. Lastly, the Trustees approved for the Mission Board to sponsor Fundraisers for the Steeple Repair Project.

The next report from the Board of Deacons was given by Dr. Chris Dawson (Melody Hawkins was not able to attend). The Deacons continue to reach out to their families with cards, visits, and phone calls. The Deacons meet every other month and send out a small gift to each shut-in and homebound member.

The next report was from the Board of Missions by Connie Harrell (Debby McBride was not able to attend). This year the Mission Board continues to prepare and deliver Food Packs weekly to 44 students at Rock Rest Elementary. The Mission Board collected items and filled 44 "Summer Fun Bags" for Rock Rest Elementary. These bags included bubbles, gaming cards, sidewalk chalk, hot wheels, activity books, etc. The Loving Beyond event is planned for Cotton Street this Fall due to hot weather. The Mission Board hosted a meal for 125 Monroe Middle School teachers. The Mission Board also supported the Faith and Fiction Book Club event with a free lunch and A potato and salad bar meal for Bible Trivia. Other missions to come are "David's Advocacy for the Homeless on June 28th and one day trip on July 28 to volunteer with CFBNC Disaster Response for Western NC. . The Mission Board also would like everyone to please look at the bulletin board in the hallway for pictures displayed of different events.

Harvey Whitley asked for a motion to accept the reports. Gary Potter made the motion and Ken Handy 2^{nd} .

Other Business: Vote on ordaining Ben Potter (Richard Benjamin Potter) to the Gospel Ministry. Mr. Potter met with the ordinance committee and was unanimously voted to be ordained. Dr. Dawson made a motion for ordaining Mr. Potter into the Baptist Ministry and all approved. The ordaining ceremony is scheduled for August 31, 2025

Dr. Dawson thanked Harvey Whitley for his 15 years of being First Baptist Church Moderator. Ben Potter will be taking his place.
