

Grants & Loans

The Haliwa-Saponi Indian Tribe has partnered with USDA Rural Development to bring housing resources to the tribal community.

What does this program do?

Also known as the Section 504 Home Repair program, this provides loans to very-low-income homeowners to repair, improve or modernize their homes or grants to elderly very-low-income homeowners to remove health and safety hazards.

Who may apply for this program?

To qualify, you must:

Be the homeowner and occupy the house.

Be unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere.

Have a household income that does not exceed the very low limit by county.

For grants, be age 62 or older Who can answer questions and how do I get started?

Applications are accepted for this program at the Chief W.R. Richardson Tribal Government Complex. For more information on how to apply, contact Tosha Silver, Housing Coordinator, phone # 252-248-3750.

What is LIEN?

A lien is a document recorded in public records that represents a debt owed on a property. Examples include: a recorded mortgage deed, a lien for unpaid taxes, and a mechanic's lien representing construction work on a property that was not paid for.

What is a FIXED-RATE MORTAGAGE LOAN

A fixed mortgage is a loan for which the interest rate does not change over time.

The annual Tribal Community Picnic welcomed over 220 citizens in a celebration of unity, tradition, and patriotism, all lovingly organized and led by Al Richardson and his dedi-

The event grounds were transformed into a vibrant festival, thanks to the creative hands of Judy Richardson and her decorating team, who brought color and cheer to every corner. Red, white, and blue adorned the space, reflecting both national pride and the enduring spirit of the tribe.

Layla Richardson, drawing enthusiastic cheers from the crowd.

As the parade wound down, the aroma of cookout favorites filled the air. Hamburgers, hot dogs, baked beans, and a spread of homemade dishes delighted attendees, made possible by the culinary leadership of Valerie Richardson, Pearlean Richardson, Chanta Richardson, and Judy Richardson.
