In the 2025 fundraising season of Forgotten Ministries, we are asking for one-time and monthly donors to support the mission of our ministry. Our ministry is a non-profit based in Enid, OK. We rely heavily on the donations of churches, businesses, and individuals such as yourself to keep our ministry running.

Has served 90,300 people

Just then, his father—battling cancer and praying fervently for his son's salvation—arrived home and was able to lead him to the Lord. It was a holy moment, perfectly timed and deeply answered."

Food Outreach

During the month of November, we were able to have a Thanksgiving outreach at Don Haskins Park in Enid! There were about 250 local community members in attendance. They were served a delicious Thanksgiving meal made by Your Family Church, along with hot chocolate, free clothing, and free groceries. The people were thankful to have a warm meal, and some of them were able to win turkeys in our turkey raffle! Every time someone comes into the clothing trailer at an outreach like this, they hear the Gospel or are prayed for. Many people heard the hope of Jesus at this outreach!

On November 14th, we had the Day of Kindness event partnered with United Way. It was held at our facility in Enid. We had many volunteers from several junior highs, the Air Force, and a few businesses. The volunteers helped prepare barrels to store food for our food ministry. They also packaged 1,000 bags of groceries in our food ministry facility, packed salt into buckets, and picked up trash outside. All these projects will go toward serving Enid and the surrounding communities.

We were also able to give grocery bags to the Lawton church, Greenfield Church, and Beautiful Restoration as well! Beautiful Restoration used their bags to host a drive-through food line in Perry, OK. "The food you guys donated to us went to a very wonderful cause. Lots of people got prayer and food, and I cannot wait to work with you again!"

We had our usual First Saturday Food Distribution, and once again, people were lined around the block. Many heard the message of the Gospel while receiving food for their families!

Abilene, TX: Grill Outreach

On November 15th, half of the Forgotten Team traveled to Abilene, Texas, for Grill Walk training with Broadview Baptist Church and the BGCT (Baptist General Convention of Texas). The team arrived that morning with two grills ready to go, but they also brought a third as a backup. They had no idea how many volunteers to expect for the Grill Walk. As it turned out, 80 volunteers attended the outreach training event! Needless to say, they had to set up the third grill and figure out a third location.

Things felt chaotic at first, but once the outreach began, food and groceries were going out quickly. Jeremiah took a moment to regroup the teams. Some volunteers felt unsure about how to share the Gospel and came to ask for help. Jeremiah went to a door with that group, and a volunteer named Diana was able to lead a woman named Michelle—to the Lord!

Later, a car pulled up asking for groceries, and one of the volunteers stepped forward. While talking with the older gentleman and his wife in the car, the man said he wasn't ready to give his life to the Lord. Jeremiah asked him, "What are you waiting on?" Then, looking at the wife, Jeremiah said, "You've been praying for him." She replied, "For many years." In the midst of sharing the Gospel, the man could no longer resist the calling of the Lord. He lowered his head, began to weep, and finally surrendered his life to Jesus.

Later, the team learned that the volunteer who had been at the car left in tears and went to tell Oza, another volunteer, what had happened.

The couple in the car turned out to be her mom and dad, and she had been praying for her father to have this breakthrough for years. That day, she finally got to witness her dad come to know the Lord.

Towards the end of the Grill Walk, the team noticed a small fire in a backyard and went over to meet a dad and his two sons. All three admitted they didn't know where they would go if they died. The younger son shared several different beliefs about how to get to heaven, but Jeremiah was able to share the true Gospel with them. Immediately, all three said yes to following Jesus.

In the midst of the morning's chaos, God was orchestrating the perfect moment for delivery drivers to hear the Gospel—and they, too, ended up giving their lives to Jesus.

In total, there were 15 salvations. God moved powerfully in the hearts of the volunteers. The pastors at Broadview Baptist now plan for every small group in the church to take the grills out and share the Gospel in different areas. Praise God for everything He did in Abilene and for all He is going to continue to do!
