## Colombia International Missions

God opened the door for international grill outreach training about 2 months prior to this trip. Through ministry friends we met earlier in the Summer of 2025, who are from Colombia originally, we were able to watch God begin to unfold that endeavor. It was no simple task, there was a lot involved in manufacturing grills in another country, and doing it on such a large scale. Then there was all the prep work of finding churches, volunteers, pastors, donors, grill walk supplies and locations, and more. Were we taking on an impossible challenge? Perhaps on our own, but not with God.

With everything in place in a matter of weeks, we sent our first team members, Tristan and Tristen, along with Floyd from Virginia, to Pereira to begin building grills. With a few tweaks to the design, they built five grills in less than a week. God was already at work, with over 20 people coming to salvation through day to day conversations before the grill walks even began. The rest of the team arrived and the training began. 140 people, many of them pastors, packed into a church to hear the team preach and train them on grill outreach evangelism. These weren't all the volunteers that eventually served on the grill walks, with that number totaling to 375!

The next day, the team, consisting of some of our staff, pastors and partners of Forgotten Ministries, split into five groups of five grills. That first day of grill walks, they saw 650 people receive salvation! Tristan noted how as you began talking with someone, tears would begin streaming down their faces as you shared the Gospel with them before you even ask if they want to accept salvation. God had prepared every single heart in His sovereignty.

One group visited a dilapidated prison, filled with 40 hopeless eyes behind bars. After they had the opportunity to preach the Gospel to them, every hand was raised with urgency to say they wanted to accept salvation. Their eyes now filled with

hope, they all waved with joy as the team drove away.

They also had the chance to preach the Gospel at a military base to over 100 soldiers, and most of them accepted Christ that day, leading out by example to the young generation of Colombians. Jeremiah had the chance to share the Gospel with a young woman working at a local market, but before he could finish, she was pulled away. He knew God was softening her heart to receive the Gospel, so he began praying. The woman ended up giving her phone number scribbled on a napkin saying she really wants to hear the rest of the story. The next day, they got a hold of her and were able to share the rest of the Gospel with her -but God had already done a work in her heart. She told them she is in the middle of getting her nails done, so she can look beautiful for the new life in Christ she's about to start. Needless to say, she accepted salvation that day and stepped into her new life.

The stories like this are endless, and we hope we can continue sharing more on our website and Facebook page. Praise the Lord for what He did!

## Christmas Outreaches

We are so thankful for the many volunteers who made these outreaches possible. We had Emmanuel Christian School help us wrap 400 of the 1,600 gifts, and they did a wonderful job! We had about a dozen volunteers attend our wrapping party and help us wrap. We had donations of wrapping paper, wrapping supplies, and gifts. We had volunteers Isaac, Emmie, and Lexie who stayed with us for a couple weeks and helped tremendously with all the Christmas outreach prep and operations. We had volunteers from Repented Motorcycle Ministry, Your Family Church, and First Baptist Church Longdale help run our Don Haskins Park Christmas Outreach. We had volunteers from Dover Christian and Okeene First Baptist help run our Christmas Outreach for the Apartment complex across from our ministry Center. And Mark and Susan Henry cooked and served the food. We couldn't do it without all of our wonderful volunteers and for them we are so thankful!

We had about 250 people attend the Don Haskins Park Christmas outreach. Your Family Church cooked and served a Christmas dinner meal, we had free clothing in the clothing trailer, free groceries available, Christmas ornament making for kids, free Christmas gifts, and FBC Longdale did worship music and a Gospel presentation. There was one salvation through a volunteer sharing the Gospel in the clothing trailer, praise the Lord!

At our Christmas outreach for the apartment complex by our ministry center, we had about 200 people attend. We had free dinner, clothing, groceries, Christmas

From FBC Okeene shared the Christmas story along with a Gospel invitation, and we had a nativity scene with some of the kids in costumes.

We also traveled to Tulsa to partner with West Tulsa Church, Evergreen Church, and Mobile Missions to do an outreach to the River West Apartments. We served dinner, free groceries, free clothing, free Christmas gifts, hot cocoa, live worship music, crafts for kids, and face painting. About 250 people came through and were not only blessed but also heard the Gospel. We had over 50 volunteers and they were all trained on evangelism prior to the event. Through this event, there were 23 people who accepted salvation! There were several church volunteers who shared the Gospel for the first time and were emboldened by it!
