Mission Teams

This Summer we were joined by Piedmont, Wendy from Greenup Kentucky, and Hennessey First Baptist teams. /during the same time, we also had interns, Alexis from Owasso, and Gabe from Mt. Vernon, Illinois. Over the course of two weeks this summer, three mission teams joined us in Enid and stepped into a full slate of outreach—simple, hands-on ministry that opened doors for the Gospel and stirred hearts for Jesus. While each team served in different ways, they all shared the same purpose: to experience God's mission firsthand, to discover their place in it, and to carry that fire back home to their own communities.

Teams spent time serving at a local nursing home, offering prayer, conversation, worship, and the love of Jesus to residents who deeply cherish these visits. They visited Sandbox Daycare, performing a joyful Noah's Ark puppet show that helped children hear the Gospel in a way they could understand and remember.

Throughout their time here, teams packaged and delivered grocery bags door-to-door, praying with families and meeting practical needs right at their front steps. They baked homemade cookies to use during outreaches—small acts of kindness that helped create connection and open hearts during Grill Walks and neighborhood ministry.

One of the highlights was preparing and serving a full home-cooked meal for the Marsau employees, blessing them with food, encouragement, and the message of Christ's love. Teams also supported ongoing ministry projects, helped organize outreach supplies, and strengthened the foundation of what God is doing in Enid.

But beyond the projects, the deeper work was

happening in the hearts of the volunteers. As they served, prayed, and shared the Gospel, many began to see—often for the first time—their own purpose in God's mission. These two weeks weren't just about impacting Enid; they were about transforming the hearts of those who came, helping them understand that God has called all of us to carry His light, and igniting a passion in them to continue the same kind of ministry in their hometowns.

Three teams. Two weeks. Countless seeds planted. And hearts awakened to the mission of Jesus.

International

Tristan recently flew to Colombia with Beau from Northcrest Baptist Church in Meridian, Mississippi, and together they finalized the full plan for our June 2027 outreach in Bogotá. This trip will partner with five churches across five different areas of the city, creating a week of ministry centered on equipping and encouraging churches, and bringing the Gospel to their communities.

Each morning will be dedicated to sports camps, giving families a fun and welcoming space to gather. In the afternoons and evenings, teams will head out for Grill Walks, sharing meals, prayer, and the hope of Jesus throughout the neighborhoods. While in Bogotá, Tristan, Beau, and their translator Andrés—who also served with our team during the December 2025 mission trip—sat down with pastors and elders across all five churches. In every meeting, they made the mission and the heart behind it unmistakably clear: it's about Jesus. The goal is to strengthen the local church, equip believers, and help them carry the Gospel into the places God has planted them. During the trip, the team also secured a local fabricator who will be building two custom grills for future outreach—another key piece now in place.

Separately, earlier this year Hayden completed a scouting trip to the Dominican Republic, and that outreach is now officially scheduled for February 2027. His time on the ground helped establish relationships and prepare the way for meaningful ministry when the team returns. As Jeremiah shared, "I pray that the church will understand the mission that God has given to us. We are to take the light that He has given us—the Gospel of good news, God's grace, God's mercy—and go take that to others that don't have that. That is what God has called us to do."



So that is the prayer as we continue to go and find people that need Jesus and want Jesus and give their life." These trips reflect that calling: to go wherever God opens the door, to carry His light, and to bring the Gospel to as many people as we can.

World Cup

On Saturday, June 27th, during the World Cup events in Dallas, our team witnessed God move in powerful ways across two different outreaches—one in a neighborhood and one at the stadium—and together saw 30 people surrender their lives to Jesus.

The day began at Full Life Church at 9 a.m., where Jeremiah trained around 70 volunteers from various churches across the area. After equipping them, the team headed into a nearby neighborhood—utilizing translators and stepping out boldly in faith. In just two and a half hours, volunteers saw 24 salvations as people opened their hearts to the Gospel.

The debrief afterward was deeply moving. You could see it on the faces of the volunteers—especially a few women who were visibly touched by what they had just experienced. One woman approached Jeremiah before leaving and said, “Even though I’m older, I finally understand God’s mission.” Her words were a reminder that it’s never too late for any of us to understand why God has us where He has us, and the calling He places on our lives.

Later that same day, during the Argentina vs. Jordan match, the team continued outreach near the stadium—this time utilizing custom-made three-wheeled bicycles with grills welded onto the back, along with wagon trailers loaded with Grill Walk supplies and coolers. These setups allowed the team to hand out free hotdogs to fans and workers while sharing Gospel cards with QR codes linking to evangelistic videos.

While out near the stadium, Jeremiah met a parking attendant named Michael. He asked Michael where he believed he would go when he died. Michael first said “heaven,” but then admitted he wasn’t sure—there was doubt in his heart.

As they talked, Michael heard clearly that Jesus is the way, and that was all he needed. Right there in the parking lot, Michael bowed his head and surrendered his life to Jesus—bringing the day’s total salvations to 30.

Two outreaches. One day. Thirty lives changed forever.

God is opening doors, stirring hearts, and drawing people to Himself. And as Jeremiah often says, when God opens the door, we will walk through it to bring the Gospel to as many people as we can.

Serve With Us!

At Forgotten Ministries, we believe every act of service opens a door for the Gospel to be shared. There are so many ways to get involved and make a tangible difference right here in Enid. Each opportunity is a chance to serve, connect, and see God move through simple acts of compassion. Whether you're handing out groceries, tending the garden, or praying with someone at the park, your presence matters. Together, we're answering His call to serve "the least of these" and share His love with every heart in our city.
