"Growing in Faith: 3 Directives for Believers to Stand Firm" 1 Thessalonians 3:1-13

1. God directs other believers to strengthen our faith. Vs. 1-5

1 Thessalonians 3:1-5, "Therefore when we could bear it no longer, we were willing to be left behind at Athens alone, 2 and we sent Timothy, our brother and God's coworker in the gospel of Christ, to establish and exhort you in your faith, 3 that no one be moved by these afflictions. For you yourselves know that we are destined for this. 4 For when we were with you, we kept telling you beforehand that we were to suffer affliction, just as it has come to pass, and just as you know.5 For this reason, when I could bear it no longer, I sent to learn about your faith, for fear that somehow the tempter had tempted you and our labor would be in vain."

Proverbs 27:17 says, "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another."

Philippians 1:29, "For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake,"

Is there a messenger that God has sent to you to strengthen your faith? If so, who? And how have they helped to strengthen your faith?

Are you in a trial that is affecting your faith? If so, what it that trial and what is it doing to your faith?

Are you genuinely concerned for the welfare of other believers like Paul had for the Thessalonians?

2. God directs other believers to <u>encourage</u> us in our walk. Vs. 6-10

- 1 Thessalonians 3:6-10, "But now that Timothy has come to us from you, and has brought us the good news of your faith and love and reported that you always remember us kindly and long to see us, as we long to see you— 7 for this reason, brothers, in all our distress and affliction we have been comforted about you through your faith. 8 For now we live, if you are standing fast in the Lord. 9 For what thanksgiving can we return to God for you, for all the joy that we feel for your sake before our God, 10 as we pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith?"
- 2 Timothy 2:2, "and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust o faithful men, who will be able to teach others also."

Philippians 2:19-23, "I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I too may be cheered by news of you. 20 For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. 21 For they all seek their own

interests, not those of Jesus Christ. 22 But you know Timothy's proven worth, how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel. 23 I hope therefore to send him just as soon as I see how it will go with me,"

3. God directs believers to <u>pray prayers</u> that are Goddependent and God-glorifying. Vs. 11-13

- 1 Thessalonians 3:11-13, "Now may our God and Father himself, and our Lord Jesus, direct our way to you, 12 and may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, as we do for you, 13 so that he may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints."
- 1 Samuel 12:23, "Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the Lord by ceasing to pray for you, and I will instruct you in the good and the right way."

Acts 6:4, "But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

Acts 20:32, And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified."

Luke 22:31-32, "Simon, Simon, behold, Satan demanded to have you, that he might sift you like wheat, 32 but I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned again, strengthen your brothers.""
