9/11 "Remembrance Ceremony"

This September 11th, Americans across the nation will mark the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks. To commemorate that fateful day, the members of the Haliwa-Saponi Veterans Memorial Committee ask that you join us in a "Remembrance Ceremony" at the Haliwa-Saponi Tribal Center at 8:30 am. The ceremony will commence promptly at 8:45 am to honor the first victims and heroes that were instantly killed when the first plane crashed into the north tower of the World Trade Center.

Let us not forget that on that day in 2001, some 19 Islamic extremists hijacked four planes and carried out suicide attacks against targets in the United States. Sadly, almost 3,000 people were killed that day when two of those four planes were flown into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in NY city, a third plane hit the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C., and the fourth plane crashed in a field in Shanksville, PA.



Let us also not forget to honor the "present-day" sacrifices that our first responders, military members, and their families continue to make in service to our great nation (and to our tribe in particular). To that end, we will also take this "remembrance" occasion to place a banner to mark the location of the "Future site of the Haliwa- Saponi Veterans Memorial."

**Please join us! COVID-19 PROTOCOL REQUIRED**

**HALIWA-SAPONI TRIBAL ADMINISTRATOR REPORT - August 20, 2021** *(edited double sided page)*

*Continuing asking all to be very careful as COVID is getting worse not better. Please as much as possible keep doing the 3Ws: Wash Your Hands - Wear A Mask - Wait 6 Feet Apart*

The DOT ERA grant is being used but slowly. As of August 20 we have paid for 129 months of rent and 64 months of utilities. Sadly many Tribal Members just are not applying. The posting to the website and social media have gotten over 3,000 views plus it was listed in the newsletter that goes out to 930 households 3 times including a 4<sup>th</sup> time special edition newsletter of just the ERA. **Please express to any Tribal Member Renter anywhere in the United States that needs help to apply.** As of Wednesday Aug 4, 2021 the DOT is relaxing even more parameters to get this money spent and they informed us that if need be we can open the apps to anyone if we are not getting enough Tribal Members to participate.

The Homeowners Assistance Fund (HAF) guidance and portal for HAF plan submission was finally released and made open on Friday July 6, 2021. The TA has started to write and submit the plan now that the rules have been released. We are in advance as some Tribes have not even submitted the request for funds and that deadline is September 30, 2021. We applied months ago. We will let you know when the apps are ready.

CARES & ARP funds have been used to distribute over 100,000 pounds of food; more than 10,000 face masks; over 7,000 pairs of gloves, equivalent of more than 80 gallons of hand sanitizer in 1 oz. and 4 oz. bottles; repair buildings, upgrade ADA compliances, paid rent and utilities for households; and much more. ARP funds are still coming in to be used for PPE, food, rent, utilities and hopefully much more once the HAF plan is ready to go.

There has been a rash of shootings in the Community including both Halifax and Warren Counties. Some have not been reporting any strange or questionable bad activity that they see. If you see anything that is strange and or questionable please report it immediately by **CALLING LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT!**

One of the shootings took place at the Tribal Multipurpose Building on Thursday – July 29, 2021 around 8:00 p.m. Law Enforcement was contacted and did an investigation of the area for 2 days taking photos and evidence. For safety reasons Summer Camp for Friday July 30, 2021 was cancelled immediately. There is an active investigation going on at this time with LE and with Tribal insurance for coverage of damage.

Again we ask: Please do not hang out at the Multipurpose Building Complex (unless using the Free Wi-Fi and using the exercise complex for exercise/recreation) and Please do not use the Multipurpose Building Dumpster. If you see anyone hanging out there or using the dumpster please call the local law enforcement and report it. Some Tribal Members are already making reports including giving local law enforcement vehicle information. We are very grateful for the help. We have gotten quotes for a full security system for all buildings and have applied for a Security Grant to cover all costs.

Sadly Day Care has been closed off and on the past 2 weeks due to a bad run of RSV going across the state and several Day Cares have been asked to close by NCDHHS and various county health departments. Be Careful.

The Humanities Grant was fully closed out on July 30. It was a great success. We are waiting to hear about the 2<sup>nd</sup> Humanities Grant we applied for.

There is still no information on the Department of Treasury Recovery Funds yet.

Summer Camp ended Aug 20th. The Multipurpose Building continuous improvements will take place immediately after Summer Camp clean up.

The new paving at the DayCare and Old AD Building is DONE. It did take some time but for good reasons. When 811 finally got all lines indicated we also found along with the Construction Crew 2 small sink holes. The holes have been there for many years and were holding steady but - Lord knows when both would have collapsed – 20

years from now or 20 days from now. The sink holes were repaired and paving was completed. Lines were painted on Friday the 6<sup>th</sup> and blocks were installed on Monday the 9<sup>th</sup>.

Tribal Vehicle Use – When the new TA got here in June 2019 Tribal Vehicle use was in the red -\$14,000.00. People used the vehicles whenever they wanted and no questions asked, etc. By December 2019 Tribal Vehicle use was in the black +\$5,000.00. This was done by cutting wasteful travel and getting a grant to cover SNS Van maintenance. Use of Tribal Vehicles requires Administration permission and logging of all miles with times of use. Recent complaints have come forward on Vans usage by the Seniors and one Drum. The Seniors have their own funds and use of the Tribal Vans comes from their own funds and not the Tribe. The SNS Seniors have their own funds and a grant they got and any use of the Tribal Vans also comes from their own funds and not the Tribe. Stoney Creek Drum were allowed to use a Tribal Van for the first time in a long time to attend a powwow in Michigan and they were responsible for all travel with their funds not the Tribe.

**HUD FULL MONITOR REPORT NEWS: the next points are on the HUD Report –**

Policies are all out of date with some going back to 1998 and some do not even exist. And none have been digitized. We are still looking for all Tribal Policies. We are re-writing or new writing the below as required by HUD:

Procurement Policy needs complete updating – last update was Oct 1998.

NAHASDA needs complete updating – last update was Nov 2003.

Preference Policy needs complete updating – last update was May 2005.

Finance Policy needs complete updating – last update was Feb 2010.

Maintenance Policy needs complete updating – last update was Aug 2010

Tomahawk Meadows needs complete updating – last update was Feb 2012.

Self-Monitoring Policy needs complete updating – last update was Oct 2013

Administrative Policy & Procedures needs complete updating – last update was Dec 2016.

HUD Training must be done by Council and Staff. We are not sure when as all HUD Training has been suspended due to COVID since late April 2021. We have been told that HUD may extend this ban for the rest of the year.

As you can see from the above list Staff are working very hard on the HUD Full Monitor Report and all should be commended on the dedication to getting this done. It is consuming the entire Staff and has been for several months as these policies are not easy to write. As mentioned back in June we did get an extension into October. We are asking for a 2<sup>nd</sup> extension due to once again COVID that has cancelled all HUD Training.

On HUD very sadly there is a lot of complaints and blame going around. We must remember that this did not happen overnight and it took many years and years to get to this point as some Findings and Concerns date back to files dated 1999. Also it is very clear that most of the Findings and Concerns are due to lack of procedures and lack of policy revisions as some did not even exist and one very important one like Procurement has a 1998 date. Instead of complaining and pointing blame let us please work together and solve the Findings and Concerns immediately so we can move on to the next round of NAHASDA (IHBG & IHP) Funds for the Tribe.

**Answers**

**1. Turquoise**

This blue/green stone was very sacred to many of the South West Nations.

**2. Havasupai and the Hualapai**

The two tribes still reside on reservations at the Grand Canyon floor and on the Grand Canyon rim.

**3. False**

The South West had one of the most diverse forms of lodging. Tribes utilized all of the following:

Permanent Earthen Lodges

Portable Tipis

Permanent Wickiups

Portable Wickiups

Log like homes covered with mud and brush

Permanent Adobe and wood Pueblos

Permanent Apartment like complexes made of bricks and wood

Permanent Apartment like complexes made of Adobe and wood

#### **4. The Apache**

The many Apache Nations became the most feared raiders of both the South West and Western Plains. Their raids were often amazingly fast and rather productive to the point that some bands of Apache gave up many traditional ways of subsistence.

#### **5. Dinè**

Also called the Navaho which is their name in Spanish. They are the largest Tribe in North America.

#### **6. Hopi**

The entire Hopi Reservation sits inside the Navaho Nation Reservation.

#### **7. Hogan**

This traditional home of the Dinè is a permanent earthen lodge made of wood logs and packed earth and clay. The home is traditionally an octagon in shape.

#### **8. Kachina**

Many of the deities of Tribes in the South West are known as Kachinas. There are well over 200 of these Spirits according to many different Tribes in the area of the South West.

#### **9. Kiva**

These are large round rooms underground used for both religious ceremony and political meetings.

#### **10. Zuni**

Many Native Tribes all across North & South America made fetishes of many things to represent many beings, thoughts and beliefs. To this day the Zuni are most known for their exquisite carvings made of wood, shell, bone and precious stones.

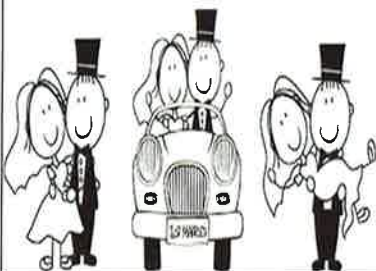

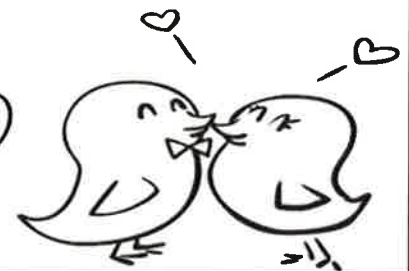

### **DEIJA Research Liaison**

We are seeking a graduate student to support research programs at North Carolina Sea Grant, NC Water Resources Research Institute and NC Space Grant to fulfill their core values and commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, justice, and accessibility (DEIJA). The position will build and enhance connections with students, faculty, and administrators at historically Black colleges and universities, minority serving institutions, relevant organizations, and other entities that serve traditionally underserved or underrepresented communities (e.g. Tribal nations, Latino/a/x/Hispanic organizations).

The primary goal of this position will be to further diversify and strengthen the applicant pools for the three organizations' research grants and fellowships. The DEIJA Research Liaison also will engage the three teams on important DEIJA issues, contribute to the three organizations' joint DEIJA Team goals ([go.ncsu.edu/DEI](http://go.ncsu.edu/DEI)), help develop metrics to measure success, and create a DEIJA recruitment and engagement plan to inform and advise the three groups moving forward.

North Carolina Sea Grant, NC Water Resources Research Institute, and NC Space Grant serve the state by spearheading STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) research, outreach, and education across several focus areas, using many different approaches in a wide array of disciplines. NC State's Centennial Campus in Raleigh houses the main office for all three programs in a single, shared location.

This part time position offers 9 hours/ week through May 2022, with an opportunity to work remotely in the Fall semester. Application review begins September 2.
