DAY 01: GENESIS 9:18-29

Noah exited the ark as the father of a new humanity and the head of a new covenant with God. But Noah was a sinner. Here, he got drunk and naked. His father's hopes of Noah being the one who would undo the curse (Gen. 5:29) would not come to pass. The promise of Genesis 3:15 would have to wait. Noah teaches us that past success does not guarantee future obedience. We are all just one day away from failure. Don't trust in your former obedience; rather, lean on God's grace for the strength to obey each day.
