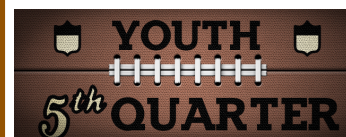

3 Expectation from God”
1 Thessalonians 4:1-8**

**1. God expects believers walk by _____ in a
way that pleases Him. Vs. 1-2**

1 Thessalonians 4:1-2, “Finally, then, brothers, we ask and urge you in the Lord Jesus, that as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God, just as you are doing, that you do so more and more. 2 For you know what instructions we gave you through the Lord Jesus.”

Romans 15:1, “We who are strong have an obligation to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves.”

Have you been walking to please man or God lately?

How have you been walking to please God?

How does understanding 2 Corinthians 5:7 of “walking by faith and not by sight” add to your understanding of how you should walk and live?

What are some instructions that believers should follow? Which ones are you doing well? Which ones need more work?

**2. God expects believers to walk in _____.
Vs. 3-6**

1 Thessalonians 4:3-6, “For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality; 4 that each one of you know how to control his own body in holiness and honor, 5 not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God; 6 that no one transgress and wrong his brother in this matter, because the Lord is an avenger in all these things, as we told you beforehand and solemnly warned you.”

Romans 12:1-2, “I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. 2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.”

Are you involved in any form of pornography? If so, what are you doing about it to stop? Do you have someone to keep you accountable?

Against whom are you sinning against when you commit sexual sin? Does this also apply to pornography? If so, how?

How does your commitment to avoiding sexual immorality point to your faith?

3. God expects believers to walk in _____. Vs. 7-8

1 Thessalonians 4:7-8, “For God has not called us for impurity, but in holiness. 8 Therefore whoever disregards this, disregards not man but God, who gives his Holy Spirit to you.”

1 Peter 2:1–3, “So put away all malice and all deceit and hypocrisy and envy and all slander. 2 Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation— 3 if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.”

Romans 13:12–14, “The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. 13 Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. 14 But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.”

John 14:26, “But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.”

Galatians 5:16-17, “But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. 17 For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.”

What are some daily, real-life examples of living in holiness?

What is the fruit of the Spirit?

According to verse 8, what power of the Holy Spirit is at your disposal to live in purity and holiness. Are you depending on the Holy Spirit to help you? If so, how?
