Unit 5.3 Devotions- Faithfulness at the Mountain, January 16-22, 2022

DAY 01: EXODUS 32:1-6

Have you ever done something wrong, but blamed a sibling? Aaron didn't come up with the idea to build the golden calf, but he certainly didn't do enough to stop it. In fact, he told the people what materials were needed, crafted it himself, and built an altar in front of it. Bad peer pressure can influence you to do things you may have never even thought to do yourself, but the responsibility is on you for how you respond to it. Aaron did not have the courage to do what was right, but by God's grace, you can. Pray for courage this week to obey God even when others are not.

DAY 02: EXODUS 32:7-14

While Moses was up on the mountain with God, the people were worshiping an idol down below. Although they deserved punishment, Moses pleaded for mercy. When you sin, Jesus is at the right hand of the Father advocating on your behalf. As those who have received mercy, we ought to do the same thing for others. We should go to the Father and ask that He be merciful to our family, neighbors, and nation. The apostle James wrote, "The prayer of a righteous person has great power" (Jas. 5:16). Ask God to be merciful and show His mercy to the people in your life.

DAY 03: EXODUS 33:12-17

Sometimes young children only want to do something if their dad goes with them, like going upstairs when it's dark or talking to someone in a crowd. Their dad makes them feel safe—like they can do anything with him—but going alone makes them feel vulnerable. Moses felt a similar way about God. He essentially told God, "If you don't go with us, we don't want to go." What Moses wanted more than anything was God's presence. That should be our attitude as well. Every step we take, our prayer should be, "God, I want to walk with you." And God promises to be with us always.

Have you ever high-fived a young child? They may go all in, but you are wise enough to know it would harm them for you to do the same. Moses wanted to see God's glory, but it wasn't safe for God to completely unveil His majesty to Moses. So, God gave Moses a glimpse of His glory in a way that would be safe. God revealed Himself as gracious, sovereign, and good. Where is it that we see these things? In Jesus. John wrote, "we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). Do you want to see God's glory? Look to Jesus.

DAY 05: EXODUS 34:4-8

When the Lord passed before Moses and revealed His character to him, "Moses quickly bowed his head toward the earth and worshiped" (34:8). He'd just heard God describe His love, faithfulness, and righteousness. He told Moses of how forgiving He is, and yet how just He is. All Moses could do was bow down and worship. The gospel shows us God's love, forgiveness, and justice. We should respond to the gospel with faith, obedience, and surrender. But perhaps the most natural response to Jesus ought to be to worship Him.
