

An innovative crisis partnership

The truth is there's a logical partnership to be made between first responders and mental health professionals.



In the vital and ongoing debate our nation is having about the role of policing and inequities in how people are treated by first responders, it's become a common talking point to speak in terms of "social workers vs. cops."

The truth is there's a logical partnership to be made between first responders and mental health professionals that benefits everyone, especially Hoosiers in crisis – and it's already happening in Hamilton County!

Operating under a grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Aspire Indiana Health has partnered with several Hamilton agencies to bring 24/7 crisis services alongside their first responders in the field.

Personnel are issued iPads and given training on how to best respond to people experiencing a mental health crisis. They can talk to an Aspire counselor via video call about the situation, then hand the device off to the

person in crisis for an immediate face-to-face interaction with a mental health professional.

Based on this encounter, the crisis counselor determines if the person needs transport to a hospital, makes the arrangements and can stay on the video call the entire time, even speaking to the admitting staff of a nearby facility. If they don't want transport, our counselors stay on the call with them as long as needed to get past their immediate crisis, and work to arrange mental healthcare for them ASAP and then follow up to make sure they're staying connected to services to prevent a return to a crisis state.

It's exactly the sort of response that people from a broad spectrum of viewpoints are talking about needing – and it's happening!

Aspire has partnerships in place with several Hamilton police departments and is working toward bringing other county agencies on board - with an eye to expanding this innovative program to other counties.

It can be hard to smile when you're battling substance use disorder. Even when they make the brave step of asking for help and seeking treatment, many SUD patients still struggle to smile – because they're afraid to show their teeth.

Opioid use is especially known to be correlated with poor oral health, but substance dependence of any kind often leads people to neglect their teeth. Cavities, tartar, decay and missing teeth are not uncommon when someone enters treatment at one of Aspire Indiana Health's recovery facilities.

Fortunately, we're bringing the smiles back!

A new partnership has brought dental care right to the doors of Progress House, with a dentist's chair set up in an available room. Carrie Stripling, dental hygienist, makes regular visits to provide care to Progress House residents, along with her assistant, Evann Rosebrough, who handles the scheduling and coordination – and is also her daughter!

Residents are also sent to a partnering dentist for dentures, crowns and other work when more intensive needs are required.
