
Every time a hand reaches out



Tribal Administrator Report November 2022

TRIVIA: Contest 17 went very well. The Trivia has gifted \$11,420.00 in much needed Food Lion funds to Tribal Members in 12 states. Thanks to all that participated the past 17 months! And special thanks to those that donated their gift cards back to the Tribe or to others that needed it most – that is True Compassion!

NCPRO: The next meeting of the NC Pandemic Recovery Office on the State Recovery Funds is November 22, 2022. This will be PANAGRAM (State Payment Portal) training to release the funds to the Tribe! If you recall this has been a lengthy process starting in Summer 2021. Remember all 7 State Recognized Tribes will be getting these funds. HSIT will be getting \$932,040.87!

KBR: The next meeting on the KBR Grant will be November 29, 2022. A Planner has been hired to help with this grant of 3 years of \$100,000.00 per year.

BCBSNCF Tribal Grant: The Grantee Kickoff for these funds will be December 8, 2022. BCBSNCF has hired a Consultant to help each of the Tribes that are getting these funds. Remember this is a 4-year grant of \$100,000.00 per year.

INTERNET: Some may have seen the news recently (Facebook & TV Media) about High-Speed Internet coming to rural areas of Northeast NC including Halifax and Warren Counties. This goes way back to the CARES Act under Trump and the ARP Act under Biden and later the Infrastructure Act under Bidden. It has been some time but hopefully you recall that the Tribe did get its name in the portals early for Communications Companies to bid on the massive grants to provide Internet Service to rural areas of America including the Haliwa-Saponi Indian Tribe.

In March 2022 we reported the funds do not go to the Institution – they go to the provider that must submit a plan to the Federal Government. Over all 5 providers submitted plans for the areas in agreement with the Tribe. Bids were a mix of Broadband, Fiber, and Satellite. In June 2022 the 45-day period for grant requests from Internet Providers to the massive Communications Bill passed.


In early August we were informed by AccessOn Network that they were one of the winning Communications Companies to bring Fiber to the Tribe! We were told to keep it hush-hush until the State and the Governor could do a huge press release! And so, on Aug 31 the Tribe got an email of the news and that same day Governor Cooper announced the \$206M in Great Expand Internet Access to rural areas of NC (including the Tribal Territory of Halifax and Warren Counties)!

We were told to be quiet again so that a massive press conference could be done with Governor Cooper and local leaders including Chief Ogletree Richardson for Oct 27. This got coverage in most media including WRAL, WTVD, WITN etc.

Then we got the official letter dated Nov 3 that AccessOne would be doing Fiber here and the project will be called **FASTER HALIWA**. The project is 250 miles of fiber cable via a 6-8 foot width area digging a 6x30 inch trench to bury the cable. They say that in one growing season all signs of disturbance should be gone. The area contains 64.2 miles of Haliwa-Saponi Tribal Territory and 62.5 square miles of non-Tribal area. This is GREAT NEWS. Credit goes to the TA and Tribal Council (over the period of 2 years for making sure the Tribe was including in the earlies stages during CARES and ARP and continuous meetings and discussions). It will take some time though as early estimates is 1.5 to 2 years before completion.


