
Aspire is proud to be wellpositioned to continue the amazing growth we've seen over

SAME DAY ACCESS BEGINS ROLLOUT

Same Day Access (SDA) for new behavioral health clients begins this month! Our goal is to massively reduce the time frame for a new patient to have their intake and first therapy session. Here is the schedule for phased implementation:

Phase 1:

Monday January 8, 2024 Lebanon & Elwood

Phase 2:

Monday January 22, 2024 DeHaven & Willowbrook

Phase 3:

Monday February 5, 2024 Carmel & Noblesville Under this system, new behavioral health patients can call (877) 574-1254 to locate our closest health center or simply walk in and Aspire team members will be waiting to quickly complete their registration, establish their history and clinical baseline, make any necessary referrals within and outside Aspire, and most importantly connect them with their appropriate level of care pathway to begin treatment expediently.

SDA will not affect family medicine patients, who can call the main number for an appointment. Walk-ins are also welcome.



FOLTZ PRESENTS TO INDIANA FSSA

Julie Foltz (middle), Director of Infectious Disease programs, recently presented to the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration on Aspire's application for Harm Reduction Street Outreach funding. The proposal includes a partnership with Step Up, with a goal to put a team of two out in the community reaching individuals who use drugs to provide them with overdose prevention/ reversal tools (i.e. Narcan), education about how to use Narcan and where to find it. information about Aaron's Law and provide access to harm reduction supplies and wound care.



While she is a Utilization

as a secretary at The Center for
Mental Health in the addictions
department. Soon after she began,
she transferred to the medication
clinic where she helped clients
receive medication samples
and medication from the
manufacturer for a lower price.

Later she moved to the UM
Department, working with
commercial insurance to obtain
authorizations for services. Upon
the merger with Behavior Corp,
when Aspire was formed, Mary

continued to assist clients in obtaining authorizations for services.

Mary continues to work with clients who come in for intake if they have commercial insurance. She will evaluate a report to determine if an authorization is required and if it is then she initiates the paperwork and works with the therapist and insurance to complete the paperwork to assist the client in receiving the services they need. Mary enjoys helping people and in her role she is able to do exactly that!

Outside of Aspire Mary enjoys working with Madison County 4H and volunteering at the local food pantry. She also enjoys spending time with her family, having been married for 36 years with six beautiful daughters. She enjoys volunteering at her eight grandchildrens' school as well.

Mary's aspirations to help people have been the foundation of her career and continue to pave her way navigating her work and home life.


