North Carolina American Indian Fund Scholarship

(this is the scholarship which is generated from having the NC AI License Tag)

This a \$1,000 annual scholarship. (it can be renewed each year up to four years) In order to qualify for this annual scholarship you must be enrolled in a state — or federally-recognized tribe (with documentation), demonstrate sustained involvement in the American Indian Community and commitment to American Indian concerns and initiative, have family residency in the state. Be currently enrolled or planning to enroll in a post-secondary institution in NC, maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA and plan to pursue a 2 year or 4 year undergraduate degree as a full-time student at an accredited public, private or technical college or university.

My feet for wings.


Just watch what each new day brings.



Kathy Harris, Community Outreach Article:

- -We will let all tenants know of important dates that will be coming up at Tomahawk Meadows and Saponi Village Apartments in our monthly newsletter.
- -Housing repairs for the community are on hold now until the existing housing is repaired.
- -All tenants, please let us know if there are any concerns, if you do, let us know.
- -We will inform you of any community events and locations coming up in the future. This will be a great opportunity to meet your neighbors, get to know them and have some fun. When we are having events, please put them on your calendars or have someone to do it for you.
- -Please remember to park only in your assigned spaces, if need assistance, please contact our Housing Dept. Also, help us keep our community housing project clean and presentable to the public.
- -If there is anyone that wants to be featured in our next newsletter, a community experience, a helpful tip, and a suggestion for improvement.
- -Please be mindful of community safety guidelines and emergency procedures.
- -All tenants are expected to keep their units clean and maintained, such as dusting, vacuuming and mopping on a regular basis. Must prevent damage and keep a healthy environment.
- -All appliances should be cleaned daily, such as cleaning filters and not overloading circuits. Report any malfunction promptly.
- -Tenants should not dispose of grease or non-flushable items down drain, maintain faucets, toilets and showers to prevent leaks and water damage.
- -Housing staff will meet with tenants regularly to educated them on the proper use and maintenance of heating/air systems. Will change filters to check for any issues, temperature or unusual noises.
- -Test smoke detectors and clear carbon-monoxide alarms, keeping fire extinguishers accessible and be familiar with emergency procedures.
- -Meetings with tenants and other community members, who are interested in getting help with their credit repair. We can bring in outsiders, such as Credit Karma. Flyers can be distributed on credit repairs as well.
- -Housing staff can meet with potential homeowners who are seeking to repair their credit, bill consolidation, pay bills on time and any other sources that will get them prepared and ready to buy their own home. Make extra payments towards their mortgage. Check with the Credit Bureaus to see how their credit looks and if their scores have increased. Prequalify them with designated Mortgages to see how they stand with their overall credit and if they need to do more preparation, so they will be ready to purchase their home.

- -On behalf of The Hallwa-Saponi Tribe, we would appreciate if all of our tenants would cooperate and participate in making their place, they call home, a great place to stay and continue to shine for our community.
- -I have had several clients to ask about ramps for their homes, I will be contacting The Aging Programs in both counties. Also, I will be contacting other agencies that may provide ramps or refer me to other sources.
- -Contacted AARP, to find out if they can hire temporary staff for the Tribe and community to be assigned to various duties to get new skills and sharpen their existing skills. This program will be for 4 years or until placed at regular places of employment.
- -Assisted in applying for (2) beds for one of our tenants who is a grandmother raising 2 granddaughters. This request was submitted to Tracy Story, who has his own business in building beds for the needy. Received approval last week for the (2) beds to be delivered to our community, including the complete sets, all the bedding and a toy for each child. The family was truly thankful to the Tribe for reaching out to them for this need. If anyone else need beds for their children, please let us know if you are interested.

Talked to a community member concerning Solar Systems to provide heating and air to their housing needs, please let us know.

Talked to someone at the Warren Nursing Facility about someone coming here to do a focus group meeting to let our community know about their facility and what they provide for the seniors and the handicapped citizens of our community.




